Supply. All post offices under the automatic distribution system will receive an initial supply of the stamps. Before requisitioning additional stamps (**item 454**), consider that the stock should be depleted prior to July 4, 1978, at all post office outlets—except designated philatelic windows and postal stores.

Post offices with 950 or more revenue units requiring additional bulk quantities: immediately requisition on Form 3356, *Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities*, from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing.

All post offices requiring additional stamps in less than bulk quantities: requisition on separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, from designated sectional centers.

Panels. A limited number of 8½ by 11¼-inch commemorative series stamp panels will be available at a later date only through mail order from the Philatelic Sales Branch, Washington, DC 20265. The panels are printed on heavy art paper suitable for mounting.

Postmasters are requested to post a copy of this notice in a prominent place pending arrival of USPS bulletin board posters. When posters are received, remove this notice.—Customer Services Dept., 3-23-78.

Collectors. First-day cover cancellations may be obtained by one of the following methods:

a. *Customers Affixing Stamps.* Customers are encouraged to purchase their own sheet stamps at their local post offices and affix them to their own envelopes. Coil stamps may not be available at most post offices prior to May 15, 1978. All envelopes must be addressed. Peelable address labels are recommended and a filler card of postal card thickness should be inserted in each cover. Orders must be postmarked by May 15, 1978, and should be addressed to: First Day Cancellations, Postmaster, New York, NY 10001. No remittance is required.

b. *Postal Service Affixing Stamps.*

Request first-day cancellations from: Statue of Liberty Stamps, Postmaster, New York, NY 10001 (see PSM, section 257.2). Requests must be postmarked not later than May 15, 1978. Indicate on cover the type of stamp desired. Remittance is required for the face value of each stamp.

Second-Class Sample Copies

The words *SAMPLE COPY* must be shown on the address side of the envelopes or wrappers or the outside cover of unwrapped copies of all second-class publications mailed by publishers and registered news agents as samples at second-class pound rates of postage. See 132.461c, *POSTAL SERVICE MANUAL*.

Cases have come to our attention where sample copies were mailed at second-class pound rates but were not marked to show that they were samples. This practice often results in subsequent computations of postage deficiencies by Postal Inspectors during financial audits, and by post offices in the conduct of regular annual verifications and joint reviews with publishers.

Possibly, some publishers are unaware of the marking requirements for samples or inadvertently fail to show the words *SAMPLE COPY*.

Post offices must immediately remind publishers of second-class publications mailed at their respective offices of: (1) the postal requirements which govern the mailing of samples, including the marking requirement and (2) the fact that unmarked samples are properly chargeable with postage at the appropriate nonsubscriber rate.

A copy of the reminder notice sent to the publisher must be placed in the permanent second-class records at the post office.—*Rates & Classification Dept.*, 3-23-78.

Supply. All post offices with 950 revenue units or more will receive an initial supply of the stamps in sheet form only, prior to first day sale. All other post offices should order sufficient quantities of this stamp in sheet form from their designated sectional center to meet initial philatelic demand. There will be no automatic distribution of coils of 100 prior to first day sale, and no automatic distribution of coils of 500 and 3,000. All Post Offices with City Delivery

Private Vehicle Reimbursement

Supervisor personnel may be permitted to use their privately owned vehicles on a reimbursable basis, in the performance of certain operational responsibilities. These responsibilities include daily outside supervision of carriers, vehicle transport operations, and airport ramp operations. Transport of personnel is not covered by this rate. Refer to *Methods Handbook M-9, Travel*.

A new schedule of payment has been developed to provide a basis for equitable reimbursement, for short and long mileage situations. When authorized, a supervisor will be reimbursed at the rate of \$3 per day or 17¢ per mile, whichever computation produces the greater reimbursement.

Each time a payment is made to a supervisor for use of a personal vehicle, the postmaster (or designee) will personally sign the voucher. As supporting documentation, the individual will submit a Form 4570, *Vehicle Time Record*, showing the date(s), start and stop odometer readings, and the total time devoted to these outside supervisions. This change will be effective beginning with A/P07, March 25, 1978.

These regulations will be included in the next revision to *Handbook M-9*.—*Delivery Services Dept.*, 3-23-78.

PAL and SAM Services

The PAL and SAM services prescribed in sections 126.152 and 126.153, *POSTAL SERVICE MANUAL*, for mail addressed to military post offices overseas, are intended to cover personal mailings of parcels and of time value second-class publications addressed to individuals. They are not intended for mailings of publications sent in bulk to exchanges or news agents for subsequent resale or distribution. Bulk unaddressed copies of second-class publications sent to military post offices overseas for resale purposes are not to be given airlift service described in PSM 126.154. Part 126, *POSTAL SERVICE MANUAL*, will be revised to insert these clarifications.—*Rates & Classification Dept.*, 3-23-78.

Postmasters are reminded that completed VA Forms 07-2008, *Application for United States Flag for Burial Purposes*, are to be forwarded to the nearest Veterans Administration Regional Office. Requests for additional application forms and to replenish flag supply are also to be directed to the nearest VA Regional Office.

Injury Compensation—Health Benefits Refund Program

This article supplements the information in POSTAL BULLETIN 21125, 9-22-77, page 6.

Health benefits refund claims must be submitted and certified by the affected employee's employing office. These claims must be submitted in the prescribed format on Postal Service letterhead over the postmaster's or his/her designee's signature. Claims which are not submitted in the prescribed format over the certifying officer's signature will not be processed.

The next four reporting claim periods are from December 31, 1977, to March 24, 1978; March 25, 1978, to June 16, 1978; June 17, 1978, to October 6, 1978; and October 7, 1978, to December 15, 1978. These reports should be submitted within 2 weeks of the respective ending date to:

International First Flight Cachet

Official cachets and philatelic treatment for the first flight services described in A, B, and C are authorized as outlined in section 257.33, *POSTAL SERVICE MANUAL*.

To prepare and send covers for official philatelic treatment for the listed services, observe the following procedures:

1. All covers must be self-addressed.
2. Applicable rate of postage per cover is 31 cents per half ounce.
3. A clear space, 2½ by 2½ inches, on the lower portion of the envelope and to the left of the address, must be allowed for the cachet.
4. An additional clear space of 1½ inches must be provided to the left of the innermost stamp to permit a clear postmark.
5. Include in each envelope a uniform enclosure of the approximate weight of a postal card to assure a good impression.
6. The covers should be mailed to reach the office applying the cachet no later than three days prior to the scheduled date of the flight.
7. **Aerogrammes and postal cards will not be accepted.**

A. Delta Airlines

On or after April 30, 1978, Delta Airlines will begin first flight service from New Orleans, LA, and Atlanta, GA, to London, England.

Lockbox Fronts and Locks

The inventory of certain lockbox fronts and parts needed for repair/replacement has reached a satisfactory level at the Mail Equipment Shops. Therefore, until further advised, dispose of excess, obsolete, and/or damaged lockbox fronts and locks in accordance with the following guidelines:

1. Remove excess, obsolete, and/or damaged combination type lockbox fronts from the nesting and send to the Mail Equipment Shops. White (pot) metal combination fronts (all sizes) manufactured by Eagle Mfg. Co., are to be disposed of locally. These fronts can be identified by the large eagle insignia and white metal front.

2. Retain serviceable 1800 series lockbox modules and report to the Procurement Services Office on Form 7358, *Serviceable Property Not Installed or Not in Use Report*. Damaged 1800 series fronts, with exception of locks and keys, are to be disposed of locally. Remove locks and keys and ship to Mail Equipment Shops.

3. Serviceable 1500 series lockbox nestings should be retained for further use as they are still considered to be standard equipment. Report in accordance with item 2 above. All other key type lockbox fronts are considered obsolete equipment. Disposed of them locally after the locks are removed. Ship the locks to Mail Equipment Shops.—*Procurement & Supply Dept., 3-23-78.*

Registration—Owner Mailbags

Some Government agencies and other mailers are using pouch-like containers as *envelopes* in the mail. For example, the U.S. Air Force is authorized to use these pouches, to transmit internal communications.

Although these pouches are mailable, they are not adequate *envelopes* for the purpose of registration. These pouches *do not* meet the sealing requirements for registered mail (PSM 161.32) and must not be accepted in the registered mail system.—*Rates & Classification Dept., 3-23-78.*

Possible Hazards from Mercury Vapor & Metal Halide Lamps

Many post offices throughout the country use Mercury Vapor or Metal Halide lights mounted on the ceilings in workrooms and dock areas in place of fluorescent tube type lights. These type lights are also sometimes used on poles in parking areas.

All personnel should be on the lookout for Mercury Vapor or Metal Halide lamps with outer globes punctured, broken, or missing. Operation of these lamps with one of these defects could expose personnel in the

area to possible hazards of ultraviolet radiation. (These lamps have two glass envelopes; one that encloses the main electrodes and another that encloses this inner envelope and the supporting elements. The outer glass envelope is primarily for mechanical protection and to provide filtration of the ultraviolet radiation.)

If a damaged lamp is located, notify the senior maintenance official so that lamps can be replaced promptly.—*Mail Processing Dept., 3-23-78.*

Delivery of April Treasury Checks

The Treasury Department has advised that supplemental security income checks and VA compensation and pension checks are to be delivered on Friday, March 31, 1978, instead of the normal delivery date, April 1, 1978.

The envelopes will be endorsed as follows:

POSTAGE STAMPS AND POSTAL STATIONERY REQUISITIONING PROCEDURES FOR PROPOSED NEW RATES

This information pertains to the availability of stamps and stamped paper in anticipation of possible rate reforms. New rates have not been finally determined. We are awaiting the Recommended Decision of the independent Postal Rate Commission. Moreover, the rates recommended by the Commission must be approved by the Governors of the Postal Service. Thus, this is not an announcement of a rate change, but provides information on the availability of postage which may or may not be in common use, and to initiate the necessary planning for rate changes.

For planning purposes, you should assume the Postal Service's proposed rates: 16 cents for the first ounce of regular first-class mail and 13 cents for the first ounce of citizens' rate mail; 13 cents for additional ounces of both regular-rate first class and citizens' rate.

Post offices will not have historical data to serve as a guide to stamp needs at the two proposed rates. Therefore, post offices should make the following assumptions in determining their requirements for the new rate stamps.

1. 13-cent sheet stamps—assume that 50% of your usage will be at regular rates.

2. 13-cent booklet stamps—assume that 100% is for the citizens' mail.

3. 13-cent coils of 100 stamps—assume that 50% will be at regular rates.

4. 13-cent coils of 500 and 3,000 stamps—assume that 100% of both are for the regular rate.

5. 11-cent and 24-cent sheet postage stamps for two ounce letters—assume that 50% of your usage has been for regular rate.

Postmasters should immediately assess their requirements of the new rate items based on these guidelines and follow the requisitioning instructions below. *Stamped Embossed Envelopes* bearing postage at the regular first-class rate for one ounce will be announced in a future *POSTAL BULLETIN*. Postmasters are to submit their requisitions in accordance with requisitioning procedures below. Shipments will not be made until the postage rate is known.

Items to be furnished Automatically.

Only sectional centers designated to distribute accountable paper and post offices with more than 949 revenue units that receive new issue commemorative stamps directly from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing will be automatically furnished supplies of the following items:

- 16¢ Statue of Liberty sheet stamps
- 16¢ Statue of Liberty coils of 100

There will be no automatic distribution by sectional centers.

How to Requisition

These requisitioning procedures must be followed precisely to assure an equitable supply of new items for all offices.

Bulk Quantities—A maximum stock level on bulk quantities applies as follows:

Postage Stamps—8 weeks
Stamped Envelopes—6 weeks

Supplemental requisitions should be placed when stock on hand is reduced to one-half.

Post Offices with More than 949 Revenue Units—Requisition bulk quantities of postage stamps from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing in the usual manner. All postmasters will requisition bulk quantities of embossed envelopes from the U.S. Stamped Envelope Agency, Williamsburg, PA.

Less-Than-Bulk Quantities—Offices requiring less-than-bulk quantities of stamps may requisition these items from their designated sectional centers using a separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, for each new item. Do not requisition more than a 6-week supply.

Supplies for Self-Service Post Offices—There will be no banded stamped envelopes or vending machine stamp booklets in the business rate denomination.

Special Notice to Postmasters

Each of the new items which are required for the proposed postage rate increase will be shipped to post offices as fast as production and distribution facilities permit, except for stamped embossed envelopes.

Selling prices on printed stamped envelopes will be published in a future *POSTAL BULLETIN* or announcement from Headquarters. Do not accept orders for the new stamped embossed envelope until authorized.




