PARCELS POST CONVENTION WITH MEXICO.

Post Office Department, Office of Foreign Mails, Washington, D. C., June 23, 1888.

A Parcels Post Convention having been concluded between the United States and Mexico, to go into effect on the 1st of July, 1888, the attention of postmasters and others is called to the following provisions thereof, which apply in the United States to parcels of merchandise (other than sample) and all other articles not prohibited, which are exchanged between the United States and Mexico, through the post offices of exchange between the two countries. All parcels for Mexico must be forwarded in the mails to the proper exchange offices.

The provisions of this convention relate only to parcels of mail matter to be exchanged by the system herein provided for, and affect the arrangements now existing only so far as they relate to merchandise parcels as provided for under the Convention between the two contracting countries, signed on the 4th of April, 1887; and all other arrangements therein contained will continue as heretofore, and all the arrangements hereinafter contained apply exclusively to merchandise parcels mails exchanged under these articles.

POSTAGE.

The postage must, in all cases, be prepaid, and by means of postage stamps which must be affixed by the sender; and no parcel will be accepted for transmission which is not sufficiently prepaid.

DIMENSIONS AND WEIGHT.

The dimensions allowed are:-Greatest length ... 2 feet.
Greatest girth ... 4 feet.
The maximum weight 11 pounds.

PARCELS-HOW TO BE PUT UP.

Parcels must be securely and substantially packed, so they can be safely transmitted in the open mail of the country of destination, but must be so wrapped or enclosed as to permit their contents to be easily examined by postmasters and customs officers

Any articles admitted to the Domestic mails of the United States may be sent, except those mentioned in the next para-

graph.
A letter or communication of the nature of a personal correspondence must not accompany, be written on, or enclosed with any parcel. If, such be found, the letter will be placed in the mails, if separable, and if the communication be inseparably attached, the whole package will be rejected. If, however, any such should inadvertently be forwarded, the country of destination will collect double rates of postage according to the Universal Postal Union Convention.
No parcel may contain parcels, intended

No parcel may contain parcels, intended for delivery at an address other than that borne by the parcel itself. If such enclosed parcels be detected, they must be sent forward singly, charged with new and dis-tinct parcel postage rates.

PROHIBITED ARTICLES.

The following articles are prohibited from transmission under this arrangement: Publications which violate the copyright laws of the country of destination; poisons, and explosive or inflammable substances; liquids and those which easily liquefy; confections and pastes; live or dead animals, except dead insects and reptiles, mais, except dead insects and replifies, when thoroughly dried; truits and vegetables, and substances which exhale a bad odor; lottery tickets, lottery advertisements, or lottery circulars; all obscene or immoral articles; articles which in any way damage or destroy the mails or injure the persons handling them.

ADDRESS AND MODE OF POSTING.

ADDRESS AND MODE OF POSTING.

Each parcel must be plainly directed, giving the name and full address of the person for whom the parcel is intended. It must bear the words "Parcels Post," in the upper left hand corner, and the name and address of the sender.

A parcel must not be posted in the letter-box, but must be taken into the post office, and presented at the counter to the post-master or person in charge, between the hours of 9 a. m. and 5 p. m.

The sender will, at the time of mailing the parcel, receive a certificate of mailing from the post office.

All parcels may be liable to customs duties, and the sender of each parcel will therefore be required to make a customs DECLARATION, giving upon a form like Model 1, A attached hereto, a general description of the parcel, an accurate statement of the contents and value, date of mailing, and the sender's signature and residence, and the place of address. This declaration must be pasted upon or attached to every parcel, upon a special form which the postmaster at the mailing office will furnish the sender. Postmasters will apply to the Department for these forms, and must, under no circumstances, forward a package of merchandise in the mails to Mexico without such a customs declaration.

RETURN RECEIPT AND REGISTRATION.

RETURN RECEIPT AND REGISTRATION.

The sender of a parcel may have the same registered to Mexico, by paying a registration fee of 10 cents, and will receive the RETURN RECEIPT without special charge therefor; but the Post Office Department will in no case be responsible for the loss of damage of any parcel loss or damage of any parcel.

DELIVERY OF PARCELS.

The addressee of a registered parcel must be advised of the arrival of a parcel addressed to him, by a notice from the post-office of destination. Postmasters will see that such notices are promptly given in all

POSTAGE TO BE COLLECTED ON DELIVERY. On the delivery of a parcel to the ad-On the delivery of a parcel to the addressee a charge of five cents must be collected on each single parcel of whatever weight; and if the weight exceed one pound, a charge of one cent for each four ounces of weight, or fraction thereof, will be collected. Postage due stamps to the amount of this charge on each parcel will be affixed and canceled before delivery. See sections 557 and 559 Postal Laws and Regulations.

DUTIABLE ARTICLES.

Dutiable articles received in the United Dutiable articles received in the United States in parcels from Mexico, under this convention, will be rated and charged with the proper amount of customs duty by the customs offices located at the exchange post offices, and these duties will be collected and remitted to the collector of customs, according to section 622 Postal Laws and Regulations.

RETURN OF UNDELIVERABLE PARCELS.

If a parcel cannot be delivered as addressed, or is refused, it should be returned without charge, directly to the dispatching office of exchange, at the expiration of thirty days from its receipt at the office of destination.

Similar action will be taken in Mexico, in respect to parcels sent from the United States.

RETURN OF PARCELS SENDERS.

Postmasters will collect from the sender of a parcel returned from Mexico, a sum equal to the postage when first mailed.
